

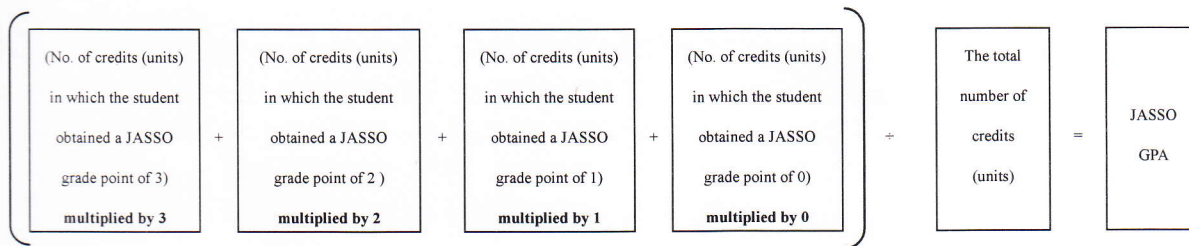
Calculating the JASSO GPA

Your GPA must be calculated using the JASSO system.

The JASSO calculation system uses your university's grading system as its base, and your most recent grades must be included in this calculation. As different universities may use different grading systems, JASSO has prepared the following table of examples to demonstrate its calculation system for converting applicants' GPAs to the JASSO GPA standard. Your JASSO-calculated GPA is rounded to the nearest hundredth decimal point.

Examples of grading scales used by universities	Grades				
Example 1: 4-point scale	-	Excellent	Good	Fair	Poor
Example 2: 4-point scale	-	A	B	C	F
Example 3: 4-point scale	-	100-80	79-70	69-60	59 or below
Example 4: 5-point scale	100-90	89-80	79-70	69-60	59 or below
Example 5: 5-point scale	S	A	B	C	F
Example 6: 5-point scale	A	B	C	D	F
JASSO Grade Points Awarded	3	3	2	1	0

Formula:



NOTE: If you do not have a GPA from the previous academic year at your home university, the GPA will be calculated based on your grades in the previous semester.

If your home university does not use any credit system, please do the following to calculate your GPA:

- Using the above scheme, add your grade points for every course you have completed.
- Then divide it by the total number of courses you have completed.
